# Student Appearance Guidelines

Please refer to the separate June mailing on student appearance guidelines for a complete description of the dress code and check the website for further dress code help.

- **Chapel** will be held every Thursday throughout the year. On chapel days, girls must wear uniform skirts, and boys must wear oxford button-down shirts with ties. No shorts on chapel days.

Note: The first week of school, chapel will be held on Tuesday so that all students can attend. Some students will be attending JumpStart off campus on Wednesday through Friday, and freshman will leave campus on Thursday for Frosh Fest.

- **Boys' Hair** must be worn out of the face, off the collar, and covering no more than one-third of the ear.
- **Outerwear** jackets and shirts must be kept in student lockers during the school day.

# IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

---

## Welcome Center and School Entrance

- **All visitors must check in at the Welcome Center upon entering the building.**
- The Welcome Center is open during school days from 7:45 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.
- Arriving before or after school hours? Check in at the Academic Office.
- Only the flag pole entryway will be open during the school day between 8:30 a.m. and 3:11 p.m. During this time, everyone will be required to check in through the Welcome Center.
- Volunteers, please sign in and pick up a volunteer badge at the Welcome Center.
- The Welcome Center is the reception point for all visitors and volunteers entering the building and students arriving late or leaving early. If you have a scheduled appointment, please inform the Welcome Center so the contact can be made. Unscheduled appointments are subject to availability. It is highly recommended that visitors schedule appointments with administrative staff and faculty.
- The Welcome Center desk also functions as the Academy's information hub. Many items are available at the Welcome Center such as viewbooks, admission applications, student and teacher schedules, locker and room locations, T.R.I.P. order forms and information, The Link and Trumpeter newsletters, school calendars, and bell schedules.
- In addition to disseminating information, the Welcome Center desk collects items and messages to be delivered to students, staff, and faculty.

## Pick-up and Drop-Off Information

- Due to school bus traffic and safety reasons, do not use the main entrance to drop off students before 8:10 a.m. or to pick up students after 3:00 p.m. During this time, the yellow curb area is designated for school busses and students should be dropped-off and picked-up at the doors at the back of the building, the chapel/gym entrance, and the library entrance at the northwest end of the building.
- Parents picking up or dropping off a student between 2:00 and 3:00 p.m., please park in visitor parking at the front of the building while waiting for the student to exit from the main entrance. Please do not stop in the bus/curb lane at the main entrance.

## Early Bus Information

*(Subject to change – Questions? Stop at the Welcome Center.)*

- Students riding buses that depart by 2:30 p.m. (Bedford, Brecksville, Copley/Fairlawn, Coventry, Kent, Nordonia, Stow, and the 2:30 Metro) go directly to the bus via the main entrance.

- All other early bus riders (Aurora, Twinsburg, Walsh, and Revere) proceed directly to the gym foyer for dismissal at the appropriate time.
- Occasionally early bus riders need to stay through the end of the school day. In this case, early bus riders should report to the west-side cafeteria study hall and inform the study hall monitor that they are not taking the bus that day.

## Traffic Pattern

- When arriving on campus via the entrance closest to the baseball diamond off Wyoga Lake Road, those dropping off students behind the large gym should bear right and follow the perimeter of the parking lot around to the back entrance. When exiting, bear right around the building until you pass the flag poles and exit straight out to Wyoga Lake Road. **The circle in front of the school is one way.**

## Student and Parent Information

- All students not in their assigned rooms by 8:15 a.m. will be considered tardy.
- Students who become ill during school hours must come to the office to call their parents.
- If a student will be absent or tardy, a parent or guardian must make a call to the Academic Office by 8:30 a.m.
- Student Messages: Please do not call the office with messages for a student during the school day unless it is an EMERGENCY. Cell phones may be used during a scheduled lunch period in the Welcome Center lobby. Cell phones that are audible or visible at other times during the school day will be confiscated.
- Parent Notes: Students must bring early dismissal parent notes to the office by 8:10 a.m. The note should include the reason why the student needs to leave early.

## Student Driver Policy

- To maintain parking lot security and efficiency, each student, faculty and staff member will be assigned a numbered parking spot and tag. These will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Parking tags will become available (\$40.00/year) on Monday, August 18, at 8:00 a.m. in the cafeteria. A fine (\$10.00) will be assessed for each parking violation (having no tag or parking in a spot other than the assigned number). Students who have not obtained their tags by the first two days of school must park in the far north end of the library lot.
- When purchasing parking tags this year, students waiting in line may purchase a maximum of two tags, one for themselves and one for a fellow student.

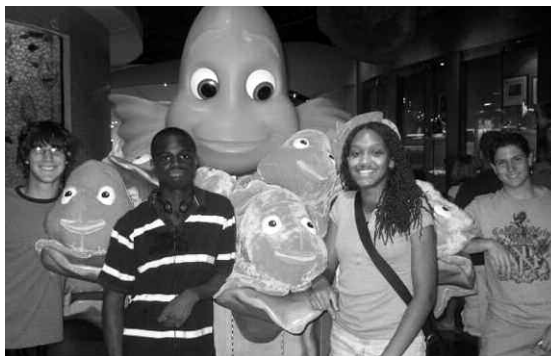

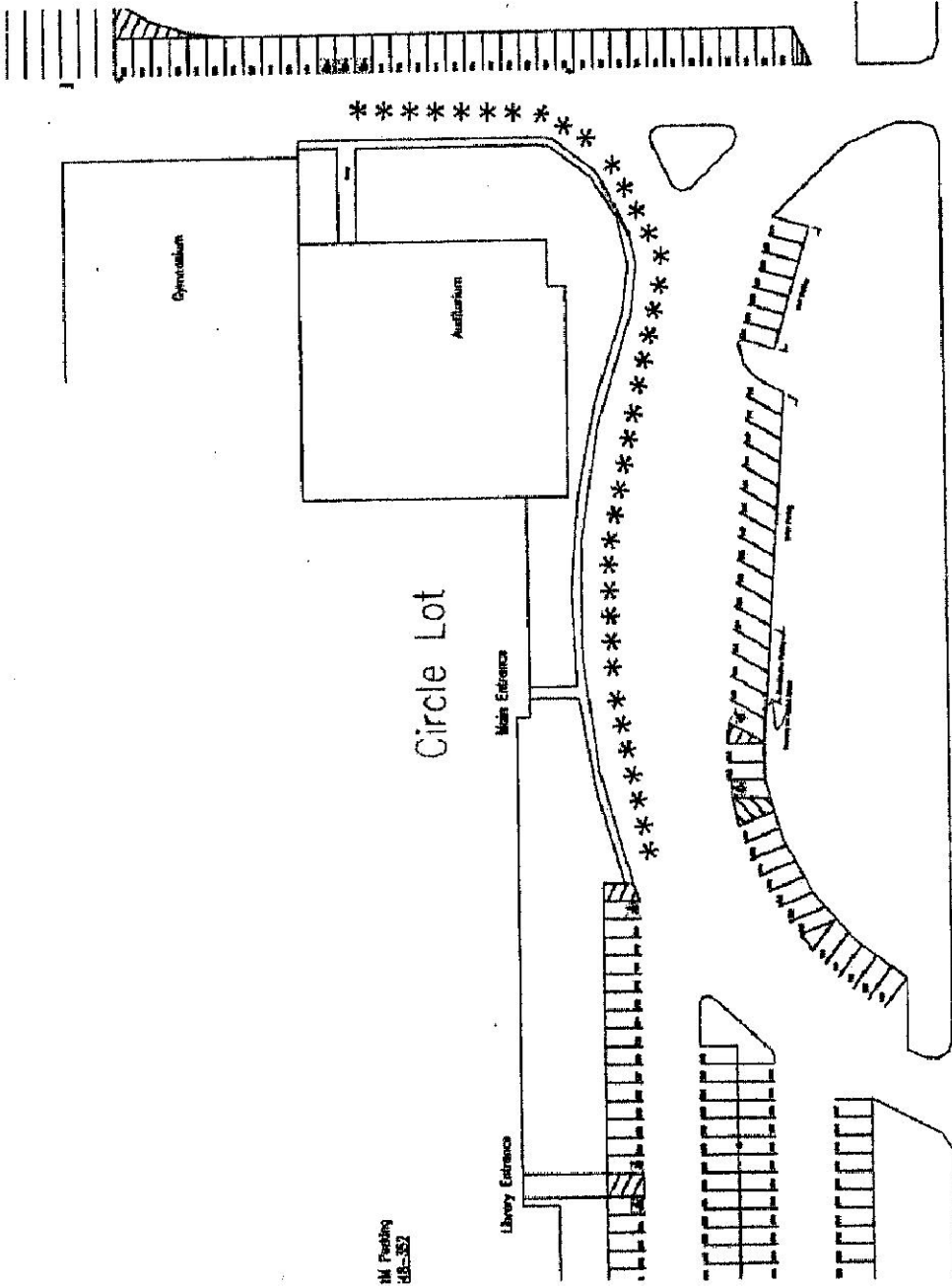
**TRAFFIC PATTERNS** – For safety and smoother flow of traffic
