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## 2011 CVCA Uniform Consignment Sale

Mark your calendars! The CVCA consignment sale will be held on **Saturday, June 25** from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. Keep in mind because of the implementation of our new Student Appearance Standards, selection and quantities may be limited.

Items to be consigned may be brought to the cafeteria on Friday, June 24 between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

What can be consigned? **New student appearance standard approved uniforms only:**

- CVCA monogrammed polos long or short sleeve
- CVCA monogrammed ribbed black fleece jacket; full zip or ¼ zip
- CVCA monogrammed black vest or sweater
- CVCA plaid or tan-khaki twill skirts – kilt or two kick pleat – Schoolbelles only
- Oxford shirts (men's only); long or short sleeved; white or light blue
- Uniform-style full length slacks tan-khaki: please note no external patch pockets, no stitching that gives the appearance of patch pockets, no rivets, no carpenter loops
- Uniform style shorts – khaki tan – walking length: please note no external patch pockets, no stitching that gives the appearance of patch pockets, no rivets, no carpenter loops.

Items that are stained, torn, ripped or in poor condition will not be accepted. No consignments will be taken on the old style uniforms. Old uniform style items will be collected and donated to Urban Vision and /or the Akron Public Schools.

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## Student Appearance Standards Update

The big change in SAS regards shoes. Keep in mind: "Look down...black, white, grey, brown."

1. Shoes can be made of any reasonable shoe material.
2. They need to be black, white, gray, brown, or any combination of these colors.
3. They need to be in good repair.
4. We don't care what they are worn under...with this exception: Girls can't wear sports-specific athletic shoes under skirts.

## STUDENT PARKING

### 2011-12 Student Parking Procedures

Student drivers must be registered and display a parking tag visibly in their car prior to parking on campus beginning on the first day of classes, August 16, 2011.

Steps for registering and obtaining a parking space and parking tag are:

1. Pick up an information sheet and registration card at the Welcome Center or Academic Office, or download from the CVCA website.
2. Turn in or mail a copy of a driver's license, car insurance card, and completed registration form to the Academic Office.

Please note: the parking registration form gives students an opportunity to designate a lot preference. The preferred locations will be assigned by the order in which the completed registration form and required copies (driver's license and insurance company card) are turned in to the office. Preferences will be processed and assigned according to class: seniors first, followed by juniors and sophomores.

Assigned parking tags may be picked up in the office during the month of August upon payment of the \$55 parking fee.

### Exciting Technology Changes Coming Soon

CVCA will certainly experience groundbreaking changes this summer. But not all of them have to do with the building project. While the major task of adding classrooms proceeds, we will also transform the library.

Our sizable work room has evolved from a library storage and work center to a mini-learning commons. Stored items have been relocated and furniture has been corralled. More recently, the area has been increasingly used for administrative meetings, student projects, testing, small classes, and technology requiring sound or movement.

Soon this area will be renovated into a full computer lab. Teachers will be able to bring their entire classes to

the room for computer use and research. While the technology department documents the need for the new lab, we still need a space for the myriad uses the room has housed this year. Therefore, a new room within the library, the Listening Learning Lab, will be created this summer to provide a space for the educational and administrative activities that have been scheduled in the workroom this year.

As we meet our student and faculty needs for small group activities that teach and use 21st century technologies, we strive to be flexible and creative. Restructuring our space will allow us to meet technology and collaboration goals as well as the computer needs of classroom teachers. ## Student Appearance

**Note: Please see our new shoe standards. We have opened up fabric choices and restricted color choices in order to give students more options and to present a more modest, neat, and unified appearance. Please purchase shoes carefully, and if there is a question, check with the office before the shoes are worn.**

### Philosophy

Student appearance should enhance the spiritual, social, and academic atmosphere at CVCA. We desire to do all things to the glory of our Lord (I Cor. 10:31). We endeavor to provide student appearance standards that are reasonable and reflect our three guiding principles of **modesty, neatness, and unity**. It is our intention that student apparel be easy for students to wear, easy for parents to purchase, and easy for CVCA to supervise.

The following standards were set as the combined effort of many people. The Student Appearance Committee interviewed students, parents, administrators, teachers, staff members, and professionals in other private schools and implemented many of their suggestions. Success with these standards will require the support of everyone in the CVCA community. It is our hope that our student appearance standards will assist us in fulfilling our mission: to educate and cultivate servants for Christ.

Parents, please note that our apparel has been prayerfully selected to eliminate distractions and promote learning. We understand that God has given parents the primary responsibility for the nurture and admonition of their children. The investment that you have made in teaching your children about appropriate dress will be reinforced at CVCA.

While we have taken care to set precise standards, no list of standards can cover every possibility. We realize that whenever appearance standards are implemented, there will be unforeseen circumstances. **In light of this, the administration will make the final decision concerning student appearance compliance should specific issues arise.**

### Privileges Carry Responsibility: A Message to Students

Within the style guidelines listed on the following tables, you are permitted to purchase your uniform style slacks and shorts wherever you can find a proper fit and price range. Please be aware that we will only be able to extend this privilege to you as you prove to be responsible. Take great care in adhering to our style standards: we are maintaining a uniform look. When in doubt about a garment, bring it to the office with the price tags still attached, and keep your receipts. Be careful to choose a **modest, loose-fitting, business-attire size in all garments**.

**Additionally, note that items that are not listed in our standards may not be worn, with the exception of a reasonable amount of business-attire jewelry. Scarves, sashes, bandannas, suspenders, suit jackets, outerwear, sunglasses, and hats are not permitted.**

### Student Appearance Standards

Basic student apparel consists of a CVCA monogrammed polo and tan-khaki slacks, shorts, or skirts. Additionally, a plaid skirt in two styles is available for girls. Students are encouraged to tuck polos in but are permitted to wear them untucked if neatness is maintained. Polos, jackets, sweaters and vests must be purchased through our website. Oxfords, turtlenecks, and crew-neck T-shirts will be available through the website, but may be purchased elsewhere. Clothing items must conform to the style and color standards listed on the Student Appearance Standards chart.
