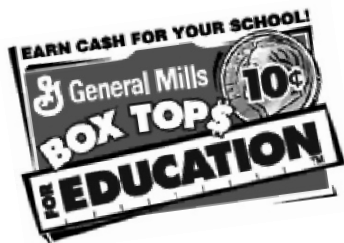

My Trip to Germany through the Friendship Connection

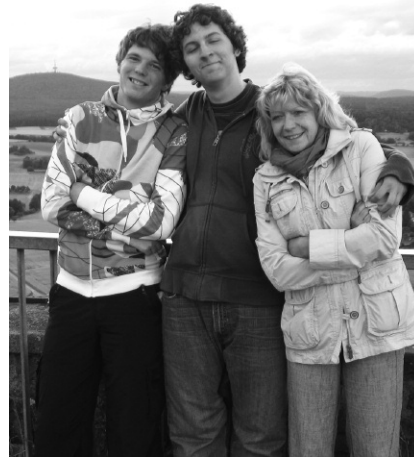

The most common question I have received about my trip to Germany is a simple “What was it like?” I can only suppose this question mainly concerns cultural, social, and economic differences (not to mention linguistics). I spent most of my time doing activities with my host partner Maurice Bechtum (whom I hosted at CVCA last March with the Friendship Connection exchange program) and his friends, doing the sort of things they usually do – which gives a greater perspective on Germany than visiting touristy sites like Neuschwanstein, lovely and educational though they are. The people my age seemed surprisingly cosmopolitan. They all spoke English at least as well as I spoke German, were extremely aware of American sports, music, and film, and were far more up to date on international issues.

Germany is truly a beautiful nation, with its densely compacted cities and villages giving way almost immediately to pure countryside. Every dwelling sported an immaculate garden, even if it only consisted of several well-kept plants on an apartment balcony. When Mr. Bechtum was driving Maurice and I to Sinnsheim to see the Concorde in a museum, and we hit 200 kilometers per hour on the autobahn (approximately 130 miles per hour), it was frankly thrilling for an American

used to 65-miles-per-hour speed limits.

I enjoyed myself immensely, and while I spent most of the time in Maurice’s hometown, I did visit some other sites close by, such as the famous church of Wetzlar and Schloss Weilburg. And of course, while I was there, the European Soccer Cup was happening, and Maurice and I went to all of the public viewings in Wetzlar. These were not the actual games, which were being played in Vienna, Basel, Zurich and Salzburg, but theatre-sized screens set up for city residents to watch with surround sound. I was present to see the German National team beat Austria, smash Portugal, and crush Turkey before finally falling to Spain in the championship game. The night after the victories, every car in the city had its hazard lights on, horns blaring; people were holding themselves out of their car windows, waving full-sized German flags in the wind – not to mention wearing flags like togas.



To be honest, some of the first memories we as Americans consider when we think of Germany are the Second World War, the Final Solution, and Adolf Hitler.

And this consciousness is not far from German minds as well. It is, after all, a felony to display the swastika in any way. Maurice told me after the first victory against Austria in the preliminaries that even he, born 45 years after the war ended, understood the guilt that his country felt. He told me that he personally felt it was not until after the 2000 Soccer Championships that

Germany could find an outlet for national pride and patriotism.

I wanted to say lastly how grateful I am for this opportunity. I could never have managed this trip at all without the help and support that was so generously provided me. I would encourage anyone to host our international students, travel to new places, and encounter new cultures. The Friendship Connection Exchange program and the trip to Germany is an experience that I will never forget.
