Periodically, each counselor will check the academic progress of the students in his/her group. We will work with you and your students during the school year to help them get the academic support they need.

We are currently in the process of meeting individually with each SENIOR, touching base with each one regarding

where he/she is in the college search and application process. We have already started to process and send transcripts and test scores to colleges for seniors who have requested us to do so.

## PSAT and ACT/ Explore Testing October 13, 2010

All sophomores and juniors will be taking the PSAT. This is a practice SAT (college entrance test) that we give to all 10th and 11th graders each year. All freshmen will be taking the Explore/ACT test. This is a grade-level appropriate practice test for the ACT. All 9th, 10th, and 11th graders will be testing during periods 1-4. After testing, their normal schedule will resume starting with 5th period.

We should have results back to you by the end of first semester.

Seniors will be going off site for their senior class picture that morning and will have lunch together off campus.

Seventh and eighth graders will follow a normal schedule that day.

## Upcoming SAT and ACT Dates

The next ACT test date is **December 11** (registration deadline is November 5).

The next SAT test dates are **November 6** (registration deadline is October 8), or **December 4** (registration deadline is November 5).

We recommend that students take each test once in their junior year and then retake the one they feel most comfortable with a second time. Juniors may want to wait until the spring semester to take the SAT so that they can use the results from the PSAT as a study guide.

EPHESIANS 4:1-5 • CVCA CHAPEL 2010/2011

## 2010-11 CVCA Banner

The CVCA banner is based on Ephesians 4:1-5: “As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called – one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.”

**Stand Together** seeks to capture two major themes of Ephesians. First, we ask where we have planted our feet. What is our foundation? On what do we stand (‘rooted’ 3:14-21)? If we place our lives and our focus in anything but the centrality of Christ (1:3-23), we are lost and wooed by the devil's schemes. It is only when we are “in Him” that we are finally alive (2:1-10) to be all that God has created us to be. Christ is sovereign; He is savior; He is central. Second, as we embrace the gospel, we are united in Him (2:11-22) as the body of Christ (4:1-16). It is in this stand and this unity we are equipped to be imitators of God (5:1-20) and live radically different from the world around us (5:21-6:9). The call of Ephesians is that of a warrior (6:10-20) who understands the gravity (5:15-17) of His calling (4:1).

Our two central questions: What is paramount in our lives in our school community (where do we stand)? If we are truly followers of Christ, do we live the unity described in Ephesians (are we together)?

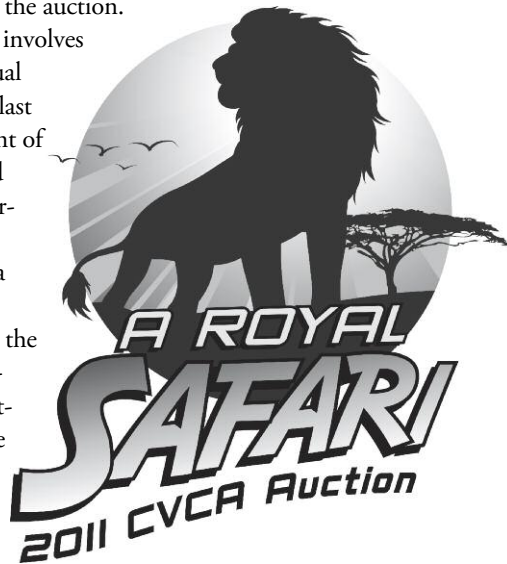
## 2011 Auction Committee Members Needed

## CVCA Welcomes Exchange

### Students from Germany by Allyson Carpenter

German instructor, Frau Waisala, and the CVCA community were excited to welcome German foreign exchange students, **Fabian Blum** and **Amina Yaqub**. A month after their arrival, I sat down with the two juniors to see how they were adjusting to life in Ohio and enjoying CVCA.



Fabian and Amina, both fluent in English, sang nothing but praises about their times here thus far! With the exception of minor language barriers – like forgetting when and where to speak English or German, they have easily adjusted to their surroundings. And as for CVCA, they love it! Amina, who will be with us until Christmas-time, explains major differences between American and German schools. “We don't follow a specific schedule that is the same everyday. We stay in the same room for the most part and teachers travel.” The Christian aspect of CVCA also shocked Amina.

“Back home, I attended a Christian school, but it wasn't like this. We don't pray, read our Bibles, or have Chapels. We just called ourselves Christian.” She considers this an amazing opportunity to be part of a school that promotes genuine faith. Fabian says a big difference between Americans and Germans is “the way [we] think” noting that Germans are not as conservative and just have different views on things. In spite of the small differences, they both agree that the food is the greatest part of America! “Good hamburgers and Twizzlers! Everything is so expensive in Germany, like Dr. Pepper, so we rarely buy it.”


