FAQs about ACT and SAT

1. When should I take the ACT or SAT?

Take the ACT and SAT during Junior Year

Each student should take both the SAT and ACT during the first semester of the junior year. After taking both tests, a student may then focus on improving their score on the test where they feel most comfortable. Students can continue to take the ACT and SAT throughout the junior year and the fall of senior year to improve their score.

When registering, list colleges of interest so that your scores will be sent directly to the schools. You may send scores later for an additional fee.

2. Which test should I take?

While there is commonality in material on the two tests, the SAT and ACT assess students differently for college readiness, and many students do better on one than the other.

At CVCA, we require each junior to take both the ACT and SAT to determine which test they will perform better on, and therefore, maximize opportunity for the highest score.

All colleges will accept scores from both tests and do not prefer one test over the other.

Increasing your score improves college acceptances and scholarship potential.
