Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy (CVCA), established in 1968, is a private, college-preparatory, non-denominational Christian secondary school. All enrolled students must fulfill rigorous admission requirements which include a record of high academic achievement, strong academic and character recommendations, an entrance exam, and a personal interview.

SCHOOLS OF DISTINCTION

CVCA offers five Schools of Distinction: Arts and Humanities, Business and Entrepreneurship, Engineering and Technology, Medical Professions, and Vocational Ministry. These schools expose select juniors and seniors to professional fields and potential majors. Students complete intensive courses, participate in professional mentoring, and experience hands-on learning via internships, shadowing experiences, competitions, guest lecturers, and projects.

JTERM

With multiple and diverse offerings, Jterm engages students in experiential learning opportunities, enriching education by challenging students in their areas of interest through educational travel, service/mission trips, enriched courses, and career experience opportunities.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

On average, 92% of CVCA AP students achieve marks typically earning college credit for high school studies and graduate with 9-15 college credits through dual enrollment and AP coursework. Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy offers the following AP courses:

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Co-curricular activities complement the CVCA curriculum by developing interests outside of scholastic achievement. These include: Academic Challenge, Christian Service Clubs, Speech and Debate, Internships, Language Clubs, Mission Trips, Performing Arts, Robotics Team, Royal Theatre, Short-term Student Exchange Programs, Student Ambassadors, and Yearbook. Student athletes can also choose from 16 sports in middle and senior high school.

TECHNOLOGY

CVCA offers a technology-rich academic environment. Every student receives a Chromebook (one-to-one computer initiative), and a 1-gigabit fiber-optic internet line assures dependable Internet access. All classrooms feature a Smartboard/projector combination, and all teachers employ a hybrid laptop enabling wire-free teaching.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

Every year, CVCA students have the opportunity to serve the community for a minimum of 16 hours either through their church, the school, or volunteer organizations. Projects have ranged from serving on mission trips or helping in Sunday School to assisting at therapeutic riding facilities and facilities for the physically challenged.

OUR MISSION is to *Educate and Cultivate Servants for Christ* by implementing a Christ-Centered Education, **V**aluing the whole student, partnering with our greater school **C**ommunity that trains and mentors, and fostering **A**uthentic faith in our students.
