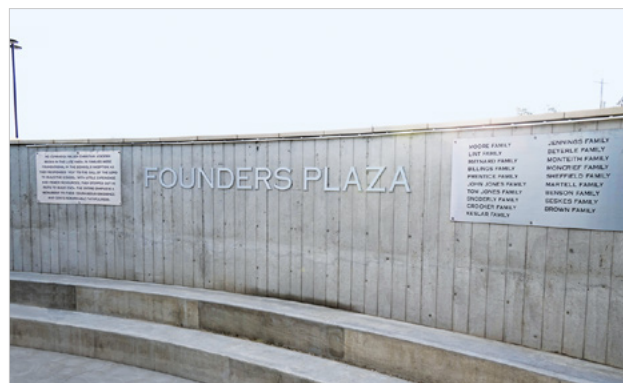

We are humbled that He would choose us (you and me) to steward and shepherd His provisions in a way that has the greatest Kingdom Impact on the lives of our young people and their families.

So why the name of the John Rasnick Center? Why the beautiful outdoor Founders Plaza recognizing the families that launched and grew the school over 53 years ago? You are asking good questions.

Yes. These incredible spaces will allow for greater in-reach and outreach opportunities for our students and families, but they are more than just "new additions" in the strategic improvement of the school and its mission deliverables. **They are reminders of what God can do with an obedient heart willing to follow Him.** While we celebrate the life and Gospel-centered influence of John Rasnick on the lives of generations within the CVCA Community and beyond, we do not point to the man or his name. We tell the story of a faithful God, a talented and humble servant of Christ, and what can happen within that beautiful relationship when we are willing to say "yes" to His calling on our life. God used the 19 families named in our Founders Plaza to launch His school. Now, 53 years later, thousands of alumni and hundreds of thousands of families worldwide have been impacted through the obedience of these Founders and God's remarkable faithfulness.

When you visit Founders Plaza (just outside the Rasnick Center), you will find not only the names that we honor but a plaque to help us all remember where we stand when we are here on the campus of CVCA. It reads:

As Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy began in the late 1960s, 19 families were foundational in the school's inception as they responded "yes" to the call of the Lord to build the school. With little experience and fewer resources, they stepped out in faith to build CVCA. This entire campus is a monument to their courageous obedience and God's remarkable faithfulness.



May we always bring courageous obedience to God's call on our lives as we continue to *Educate and Cultivate Servants for Christ!* May we always say "yes" when we hear His voice.

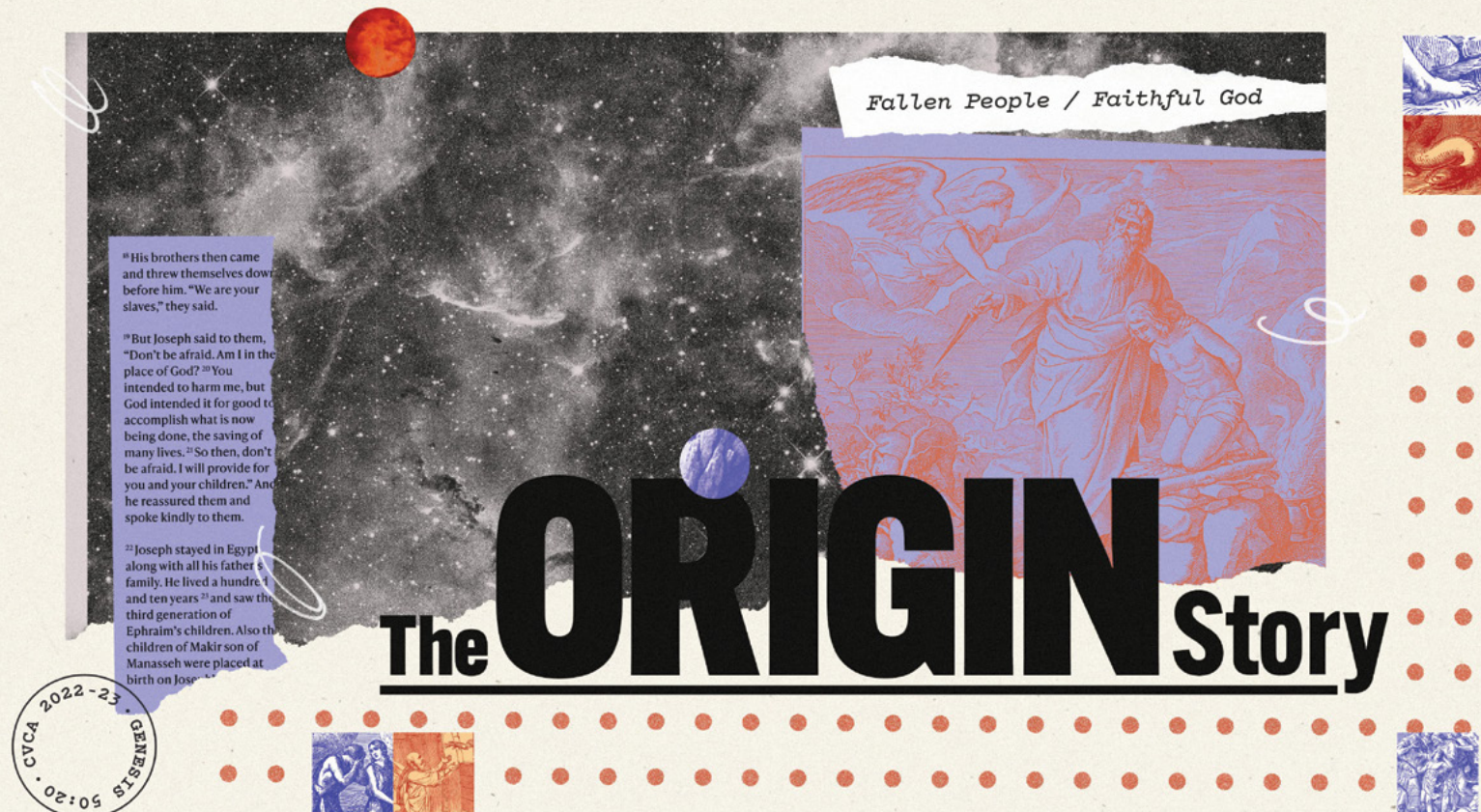

Chapel Banner 2022-2023

Every year we choose a book of the Bible to study in our weekly Chapel services. That book becomes our "banner" for the school year. The imagery of a banner is found in the Old Testament, where it was something to rally people under. So even though our CVCA community attends over 150 different churches, lives all over Northeast Ohio, and comes from various backgrounds, the one banner we rally under is Jesus Christ. And one specific way we honor Jesus is by valuing His Word.

This year we are studying the book of Genesis with the banner: **The Origin Story – Fallen People/Faithful God**. One of the biggest questions people ask is, "Where did I come from?" Origin stories have fascinated humanity throughout time, for we all have a deep desire to know our backstory. Whether it's Romulus and Remus or Ancestry.com, people have gone to great lengths to answer the question, "Who are we?" Our origin story not only recounts our past but even helps us understand why we are the way we are. In many ways, our backstory shapes who we are, and the more we know about the backstory, the better we know ourselves.

Genesis means "origin or beginning," so as followers of Jesus, we look to His Word to answer the question, "Where did we come from?" But our origin is not just about "where," it's about "who." We find in Genesis that humanity's origin begins with a faithful God who created people in His image and placed them in a beautiful world in which they were encouraged to thrive. Yet we chose to break that relationship, choosing our way instead of God's. The storyline of Genesis (and the rest of the Bible) is that of a fallen

people relentlessly pursued by the faithful God. This year as we study Genesis, we will learn more about ourselves and more about our faithful God. Genesis is OUR ORIGIN STORY: a fallen people and a faithful God.

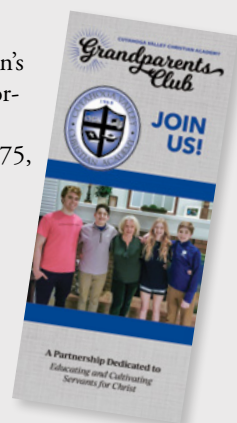
THE IMPACT OF CVCA'S GRANDPARENTS CLUB

Opportunities for Fun and Growth through Extra-Curriculars

CVCA's extra-curricular activities play a significant role in helping students find a place of community within our larger student body. With a wide range of opportunities – social, academic, scientific, creative, and athletic – students often find new interests that also help shape them academically and socially for college and beyond.

The **Talking Royals** is CVCA's Speech and Debate team. This extra-curricular program allows students to hone their public speaking skills and strengthen their confidence while also having fun. Students specialize in a single speech or debate category, from acting to public address to debate, and compete against students from schools all around Northeast Ohio. Last year, our team grew from 4 to 12 competitors, all of whom were new to competitive speech and debate and sent two students to the State Tournament. The team has continued to grow

this year with a roster of about 30 competitors. **Brittney Ulatoski**, a CVCA junior, shared her experience on the Talking Royals: "Speech and debate can be seen as the scariest thing in the world, but it's not. People assume all you do is go up on stage in front of people and debate them; however, there's more than that. Speech and debate are separate categories where speeches are either written by the student performing them or a script that a student memorizes and performs. For debate, there are one-on-one or two-on-two debates, as well as congressional debate. Tournaments run every Saturday from November to February. At tournaments, you meet so many different people and make lasting memories. Even though we compete against each other, we also help each other, give tips, and tell each other how to improve. It's a fun and encouraging experience being on the Talking Royals team. There is never a dull moment when competing at a speech and debate tournament!"

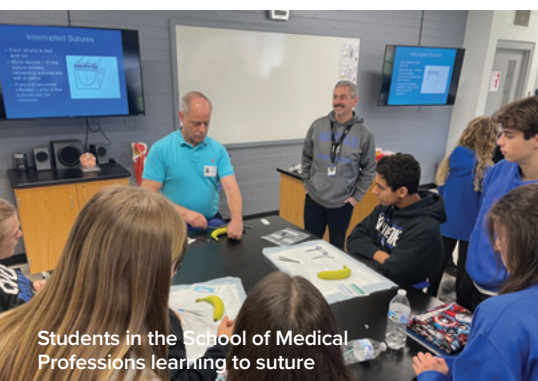


THE IMPACT OF EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

SCHOOL OF ARTS & HUMANITIES

Director Mr. McSparran:

Why are you passionate about SOAH?

Unlike the tight focus of other SODs, SOAH is built to fit a wide range of students who might be interested in fine arts, music, writing, teaching, communications, social sciences, law, or criminal justice. We exist to know and love students as they discover and grow into the whole person God has made them to be.

What do you hope SOAH students take with them when they graduate?

We hope they all know that they are created uniquely in the image of God also to create. We hope students will take with them confidence in their genius, flexibility, graciousness, problem-solving, and a better knowledge of how they might honor God with their passions and talents.

What are some unique SOAH opportunities?

Sometimes school can feel like Sea World, and not in a good way. You have majestic creatures swimming endlessly in a tank that feels a bit too small, who are asked to jump through hoops – and if you do it correctly, someone will jam fish down your throat so you don't starve. We aim to break that cycle and enliven the spirit through a highly customized program that empowers students to learn and grow in ways they're interested in while being a part of a loving, spirit-filled community.

What are some of the unique opportunities SOBE provides? Business Pitch Night, Marketing Event Night, running three different businesses (with executive positions available for seniors), and working with actual companies.

I love the freedom to be as creative as possible in a business environment.

What advice would you give sophomores considering SOBE? SOBE will give you a comfort and confidence in yourself that you may not receive in other classes.

SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

Director Mr. Fairchild:

Why are you passionate about leading SOE?

The most satisfying thing about teaching engineering is seeing students discover their passions and gaining the skills necessary to pursue them.

What do you hope students that go through your program take with them when they graduate? I would love for our students to be excited about tackling challenging problems and use their creativity and skills to solve them in unique ways.

What unique opportunities does SOE provide students?

Students collaborate and creatively solve problems in various areas representing mechanical, civil, aeronautical, and electrical engineering while learning how to design in a computer-aided design environment. The SOE experience culminates in a Capstone project of their choosing where they design, build, and test in an area they are passionate about. They learn teamwork and how to bring their knowledge and creativity to any problem.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS & ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Director Mrs. Chamberlain:

Why are you passionate about SOBE?

It thrills me to see students step out of their comfort zones, grow as leaders, work in teams, and become amazing problem solvers! Regardless of their career path choices,

This school encourages and celebrates something God made that He's pleased with: our bodies and the ability to solve problems with and for people with the respect and love that Jesus would show.

What do you hope students that go through your program take with them when they graduate? I hope they are convinced that they are on the path God has for them to better care for the needs of the people around them.

What unique opportunities does SOMP provide? Case study learning, often used in medical school, is employed in much of our teaching. Students learn practical, hard skills like measuring blood pressure and pulse, drawing blood, and high-level microscope work. Students have exclusive opportunities to hear from a variety of medical professionals.

SOMP Student:

What do you love the most about being a member of SOMP? I love that the school takes you on a path toward possible careers without being too specific.

What is your favorite activity from your time in SOMP? In CL Anatomy and Physiology, we did many labs. I found them to be very engaging supplements to our lessons.

SCHOOL OF MINISTRY

Director Mr. Ernisse:

Why are you passionate about SOM?

Glorifying God is the chief end of man. I get to help students understand how they can glorify God wherever they go.

What do you hope students that go through SOM take with them when they graduate? I hope they have a humble confidence in how to integrate their relationship with Christ wherever they work.

Every student is uniquely gifted and on their own journey in understanding God's calling on their life and how a career choice might be part of that call. While every School of Distinction has incredible core classes and projects, value-added opportunities, or "Experience" opportunities, elevate the student experience and maximize the impact of their SOD participation. Students choose from a variety of "Experience Classifications" based on their changing interests and goals:

- **Exploratory Classification** – Designed to help students discern if a career in their SOD might be right for them.

- **College Classification** – Designed to help students discern potential college majors and/or get a head start on college prep coursework and required skills.
- **Career Classification** – Designed to help students get an in-depth understanding of a career cluster through real world experiences in the field.

In order to graduate with distinction in a CVCA SOD, students must complete three units worth of Experiences. Examples of Experiences include: Career Window Speakers, Community Hack Problem Solving Challenges, College Field Trips,



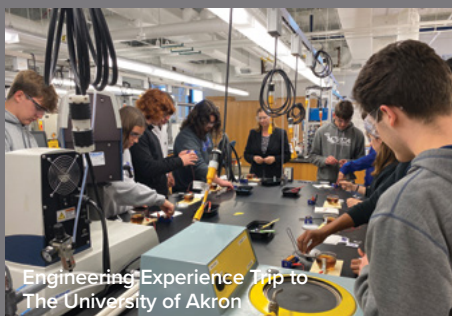

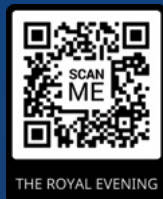

Helping Students Navigate their College Search

In the past year, CVCA's College Counseling office has grown to accommodate the needs of our current families to access quality resources, personalized college counseling, and general assistance with applying to the "best fit" colleges for each student.

As a first step, CVCA's College Placement Advisor, Mrs. Emily Knapp, schedules appointments with juniors (with an invitation to their parents) to walk through important college application deadlines and key decision points involved in each student's unique college decision journey. During a student's senior year, Mrs. Sara Fridline, our Director of College Counseling, assists students with completing their college applications, refining their college

resumes, and collecting strong recommendation letters to enhance their chances of admissions success at their colleges of choice.

As an additional resource, we are pleased to announce the release of CVCA's College Counseling Handbook, a comprehensive guide for ninth to twelfth-grade students packed with helpful resources and information about how to guide your CVCA student toward a "best-fit" decision regarding college selection and application. Hard copies are available in our Office of School and College Counseling for family meetings with our college counselors. Copies will also be available at our college planning expo for students and parents in January.

SPRING COLLEGE "EXPO"

In January, CVCA's Office of School and College Counseling will sponsor a "college expo" to highlight ways each family can maximize their opportunities at CVCA to secure admission to the "best fit" college for their children over the course of high school at CVCA. Questions about college recruitment, CCP and AP coursework, financial aid pathways, and other highly pertinent information will be covered. Several local colleges will also provide admissions representatives to answer university-specific inquiries that evening. We aim to kickstart students' success at gaining admission to a great college and coach parents through the ins and outs of taking positive next steps in their children's education after CVCA.

▼ Our **Cheer** program continues to set the standard for school spirit. Each Friday night featured a theme, and the girls created run-through banners to match. Their enthusiasm for the Royals is unmatched.



▲ The **Girls Cross Country Team** won their 22nd consecutive PAC-7 Championship. They tallied just 26 points on their way to the Conference title. They also qualified for the Regional Tournament, where they finished 10th.

▼ The **Volleyball Team** battled to a record of 16-9 this season. Highlights of the year include a big home win over Triway, a seven-match winning streak, and a Sectional Championship.

▼ For just the second time in program history, **CVCA Football** captured a Conference Championship and qualified for the OHSAA State Playoffs in the same season. CVCA finished the year 7-4 after earning a share of the PAC-7 title and securing a home Division III playoff game.



▼ The **Girls Golf Team** competed hard and continued to improve throughout the fall. With six letter winners slated to return next year, the Royals will build on this season moving forward.

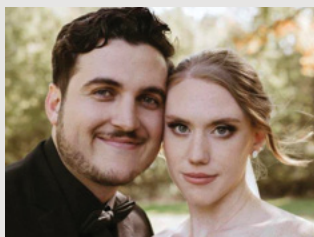

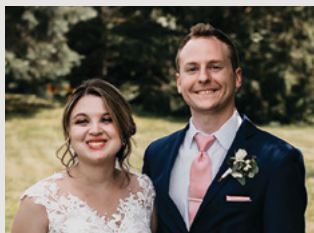

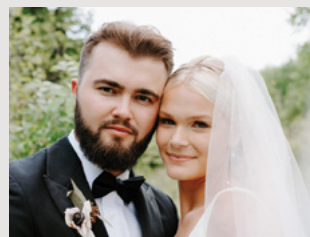
