WORLD LANGUAGE

- A short summary (in Spanish) of the activity. For example, if it was a newspaper article, what it was about and what country it was from. For a movie, the name of the movie and plot line. If you want to watch a movie, both the audio AND subtitles musts be in Spanish.
- Total time spent on each activity totaling no less than 30 minutes/week for at least 8 weeks! Students must seek out and engage in a variety of activities – some grammar, some music, some news articles, some language learning programs, some cultural sites, etc.
