Welcome to January Term 2026!

CVCA's January Term (Jterm), running from January 5–9, 2026, is designed to provide students with expanded learning opportunities beyond the traditional classroom. Through enrichment electives, educational travel, service and mission trips, and Career Experience Opportunities (CEO), Jterm encourages students to explore areas of personal interest while building deeper connections with faculty and peers.

High School Jterm Overview

Participation in Jterm is a graduation expectation for all high school students. Students must be enrolled in **one** of the following options for Jterm:

- All-day class
- Morning (AM) **and** afternoon (PM) class session - creating a full day experience
- Career Experience Opportunity (grades 9-12)
- Trip
- Mission Trip Exemption
- Student Independent Study (parent proposal required)

Students who are not registered for Jterm should not report to school and will receive unexcused absences for the week.

Winter Athletes & Travel Guidelines

Winter athletes are expected to select local Jterm options to ensure they can fully participate in practices and games, as outlined in the Student/Parent Handbook. Exceptions may apply if the team is participating in a Jterm-related experience. For questions or clarification, please contact the Athletic Department directly.

AM - MORNING OFFERINGS

American Ninja Warrior - AM

Leader: Mrs. C Thompson, Mr. N Thompson

Cost: \$160

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Train like an American Ninja Warrior! Each day consists of an hour-long class along with free time and obstacle exploration. Nicole Bann, owner and head coach of Super Ninja Zone, is our class instructor each day. Nicole is certified by the UNAA (Ultimate Ninja Athlete Association), a Certified Youth Fitness Trainer, Certified Personal Trainer, CPR, and First Aid Certified. Classes consist of stretching, warm-ups, exercises, lessons, and hands-on attempts at the obstacles. This course includes a focus on learning skills and techniques within the sport, such as how to do jumps and transfers, and techniques on swinging/hanging obstacles. Verbiage used within the sport, such as Lock Offs, Parkour, and Laches, is also taught in this class. Lessons on safety, upper body, lower body, stations, and competition, as well as segments about the names of muscle groups, nutrition advice, and how to achieve more confidence and maintain a positive attitude. Through positive reinforcement, Super Ninja fosters a growth mindset for its students.

Art Through Needlework – AM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Do you struggle artistically or find it difficult to come up with your own designs? Learning counted cross-stitch enables you to take someone else's artistic ability and create intricate works of art worthy of framing. In this class, you will learn how to read a counted cross-stitch pattern and transform it into a beautiful work of art.

Biblical Manhood - AM

Leader: Mr. R Carroscia

Cost: \$35

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12 (Boys Only)

The objective of the course is to discuss and study the topic of Biblical Manhood, comparing and contrasting what the world and what the Bible has to say about manhood. The focus will be to answer the question: "What does it mean to be a man?" The course will provide timeless truths and practical insights on how we can live to be the men God intended us to be. To develop men who are committed to follow the courageous footsteps of Jesus into authentic manhood; men who will reject passivity, accept responsibility, lead courageously, and expect the greater reward (invest eternally). The book from which those 4 cornerstones of manhood come is *Raising a Modern-Day Knight*, by author-pastor Robert Lewis; he shares a unique approach to shaping a boy into a man by equipping him with three essential elements: a vision, a code of conduct, and a cause (Christianity) in which to invest his life. The course will also include sermons/podcasts by Alistair Begg, RC Sproul, Voddie Baucham Jr., and Nancy Pearcey, as well as discussions about the books: *Thoughts for Young Men* by J.C. Ryle and Tim Keller's *Thoughts on Self-Forgetfulness*.

Golf - Get in the Swing - AM

Calling all golfers and those who would like to try golf. We will go each morning to the Golf Dome in Chagrin Falls and hit balls on Trackman. We will also spend some time working on the short game with an emphasis on putting. Guys and girls of all skill levels are welcome.

Greatest Sports Moments in History - AM

From historic grand slams to world record sprints, from the rumble in the jungle to the block heard round the world, we will go through and watch some of the most iconic moments and games in sports history. Each day, we will watch one of the all-time great sporting events or a movie about the event. We will have snacks and talk about the historical significance of some of the events as well. Come ready to enjoy some of the most incredible athletic feats known to mankind.

Heavy Board Games - AM

Come play heavy board games. Jewels and Beads - PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12 (Girls only)

Do you enjoy the beauty of jewelry? Would you like to create bracelets, earrings, and possibly a necklace that are all more than just stringing some beads on elastic or thread? They will be fun to wear and they will make awesome gifts! We will be working with needles, "Fireline" (fishing) thread, and some beautiful patterns for our jewelry. Some Swarovski crystals and pearls will be used (though they aren't being produced anymore), as well Preciosa crystals and pearls in making many of our works of art. You will learn how to cut and prepare the Fireline thread, and will begin by using the Swarovski crystals and pearls. The patterns will increase in detail and in steps, and will clearly enable you to create intricate designs. Possible projects include lengthening bracelets into necklaces or making earrings to match the bracelets.

Kingdom Hospitality - AM

Does your heart yearn to make others feel welcome? Do you long to let others know that they belong? If so, join us in an adventure of Kingdom hospitality. From the practical to the spiritual, we will explore ways to welcome others into our

Learn to prepare for overnight guests; explore how to host a dinner party, including planning the menu, creating a comfortable atmosphere, and delighting your guests with opportunities to engage in games and conversation. Learn how to anticipate the needs of your guests, and grow in your understanding of the importance of welcoming refugees, immigrants, and international students into your lives. Celebrate the beauty of coming together as members of the body of Christ as we investigate the scriptural underpinnings and the practical outworkings of Kingdom hospitality. Attention high school athletes and fitness enthusiasts! Are you ready to take your performance to the next level? Join us for SCOR Jterm, an exclusive hands-on training experience designed to help you build strength, prevent injuries, and gain the knowledge to train smarter and set yourself up for long-term success in sports and fitness. Students will learn principles for healthy training, complete a workout and enjoy snacks and debrief at the end of each day.

If so, join the Shakespeare J-Term. We will spend the week performing some of Shakespeare's plays in a readers' theater. We will enjoy some plays that are not taught in CVCA's English classes, but which come from among Shakespeare's comedies, histories, and tragedies. Especially the tragedies.

Survey of Significant Motion Pictures Throughout Film History - AM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

This class is for the person who enjoys the craft and art of storytelling through the medium of film. Film style and the way movies are made have changed over the decades, but it remains a powerful art form in which stories are told visually. We will be viewing films ranging in time frames from the 1950's through the current decade, examining what makes the selected movies notable or remarkable in their place in film history. Step into the courtroom for an immersive one-week Jterm experience where you'll discover how the justice system really works. In this hands-on course, you'll learn the roles of attorneys, witnesses, and jurors while working behind the scenes to prepare for a full mock trial. Along the way, you'll hear directly from judges, lawyers, and other legal professionals who will share insider perspectives on the court system. The week culminates in a live trial simulation where you and your classmates bring the case to life—making this an unforgettable, real-world learning opportunity.

Vintage Voltage – AM

Ever wonder what happens when you unplug from the digital world and dive into the hands-on, tactile universe of analog technology? Welcome to Vintage Voltage - a hands-on workshop exploring all things analog! From vintage radios and film projectors, to vinyl players, classic synthesizers, and old-school cameras - you'll get to see, touch, and appreciate the art of analog technology. This experience will focus on film photography, allowing each student to experiment with shooting, developing, and scanning 35mm film!

What's it mean to be a Christian Athlete? – AM

Athletics can be a very important aspect in the life of a follower of Christ. What does it look like when we are called to be different from the world? How does this change an athlete's mindset in preparing, training, competing, working alongside teammates, coaches, and a culture that is contrary to who we are as believers? This won't answer all your questions, but it will provide a foundation to make the most out of your experience as a Christian athlete and give you some tools to make the most of your experience!

Worship Writing - AM

Cost: \$10

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Students who participate in this course will learn to write worship music and lyrics in a Biblical manner, culminating in the performance of a homemade worship set! Together we will discuss how the Bible talks about worship and common pitfalls in practicing worship. We will encourage one another to pursue beauty and truth in writing worship for ourselves and others in a way that is accessible and authentic to the call of the gospel.

To do this well will spend time looking at examples of biblical worship and some of the best (and worst) examples of worship in writing and in music in our culture and cultures past. We will analyze psalms, hymns, poems, contemporary worship, and hopefully get dragged down various rabbit holes along the way (Rap, Christian rock, Transcendentalism, the idolization of virtue, art maybe) depending on what students want to talk about. This year, with Mr. Nussen we will add a great deal of focus on symbolism and connecting our words with Biblical ideas.

PM - AFTERNOON OFFERINGS

Backyard Tourist – PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Northeastern Ohio has a lot of great places to visit, but oftentimes, we take them for granted, meaning to see them “one day.” Make “one day” happen in January 2026! With a combination of guided tours, presentations, and individual or small-group exploration, we’ll visit a different place each afternoon (Cleveland Museum of Natural History, Cleveland Art Museum, Lock 3 Winterblast, Pro Football Hall of Fame, Rock and Roll Hall of Fame). Come explore the sightseeing opportunities in our own backyard! Prerequisites: an open mind, an enthusiastic spirit, and an interest in learning more about a variety of area attractions.

Build Your Own Escape Room - PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Do you love puzzles, mysteries, and challenges that test your creativity and brainpower? In this one-week Jterm course, you’ll step into the world of escape rooms—not just as a player, but as a designer. Together, we’ll explore the secrets behind great escape rooms by learning game theory, storytelling, and puzzle design. You’ll also get the chance to experience a professional escape room in the area to see how the pros do it.

Then the fun really begins: working in a small team, you’ll transform a CVCA classroom into your very own escape room. By the end of the week, you’ll swap rooms with classmates and race against the clock to see if you can “escape.” Teachers and staff will also be invited to test their wits in your creation!

Get ready for a week of creativity, collaboration, and friendly competition. This course will stretch your problem-solving skills, challenge your teamwork, and unlock a whole new way of thinking about games and learning. The only question is—will you escape?

Cooking 101 - PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Know your way around the kitchen? Left on your own, could you make a few different meals for yourself and not go hungry? On day 1 of the class, we will plan a menu for the week and shop for ingredients. Then, we will head to my kitchen the rest of the week to try our hand at baking, boiling, air frying, and Instapot-ing. Most of our meals will be meant for your consumption. However, we will also create a variety of treats for the faculty and staff at one of our feeder schools to enjoy!

Culture Con Cuisine - PM

Cost: \$260

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Pack your appetite and sense of adventure — this hands-on course is your passport to global cultures through the universal language of food!

Each day, we'll dive fork-first into a different region of the world, exploring its traditions, values, and stories through the meals that define it. You'll not only taste the flavors but learn what they mean. Think of it as a delicious blend of history and culinary arts — minus the boring lectures, plus a lot more garlic.

Students will prepare signature dishes, explore local ingredients and restaurants, decode the cultural significance behind mealtime rituals, and maybe even dance a little while making tamales (no pressure, but it happens).

By the end of the week, you won't just be full — you'll be fulfilled. And yes, you'll go home with new cooking skills, fun facts, and a few global grandma-approved recipes to show off.

Warning: Side effects may include spontaneous cravings, deep cultural insights, and the sudden urge to host international dinner parties.

Driving Education - PM

Leader: DriveTeam

Cost: \$895

Grades: 9-12 (Students must have a learner's permit by December 31)

Advisory: Students **must** attend a two-day "Vehicle Dynamics Course Hands-On Skills Training in a Controlled Environment" (**Mandatory Skills Weekend - Saturday, 1/3/26 & Sunday, 1/4/26 from 8am-4pm each day**).

**Cost of course covers the entire DriveTeam Package, not just the 5 days of Jterm. Please note: Due to the State of Ohio requirements for classroom hours, this class will meet Monday-Friday, from 11:30 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. each day of Jterm.*

Drive Team offers a four-level, state-licensed program that far exceeds Ohio's minimum requirements for driver education. Students will complete the "Academics of Driving" portion of the program during Jterm. Lessons will focus on traffic laws, traffic signs, and the responsibilities of driving. A workbook is provided. After Jterm, DriveTeam will arrange with individual students for the "On the Road, In-Car Instruction" portion of the program; this will be followed by the "Exit Appointment."

DriveTeam is a local provider of Performance-Based Driver Education for teens. They teach and train each student until he or she is ready to "solo" as a safe driver. More information about the company can be found at [DriveTeam](#).

Entrepreneurship in Action - PM

Enjoy playing games? Ever thought about MAKING a game? Like the idea of turning a game into a business? Sign up for Entrepreneurship in Action! Students will spend a day studying the art of tabletop games as they begin brainstorming ideas for a new game. They will then spend the next few days creating their own games (with a partner), using the iLab and other resources accordingly, and even writing up a simple business plan. They will then end the week by pitching their games and celebrate by playing!

Hiking the CVNP - PM

Hiking the CVNP is an incredible experience to become immersed in God's creation in our own backyard! We will spend each day traveling to a different corner of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park and seeing the wide array of landscapes that are all contained in northeast Ohio. Students will hike areas such as Oak Hill, Buckeye Trail, Brandywine Falls, and Towpath, and will be able to experience God's beauty first-hand. Each day will start with a historical lesson about the area we are hiking, as well as a devotional to prepare us to appreciate God's creation.

Holy Smokes - PM

We have four passions in life: faith, family, fitness, and flames. We would hope to share two of them, faith and flames, with the students. Time would be spent exploring, sharing faith, and cooking BBQ. Students will learn how to cook BBQ, side dishes, and dessert both on the grill and smoker.

Pizza and Hip Hop - PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Discover the powerful world of sacred art and religious imagery that has shaped cultures and inspired believers for thousands of years. This hands-on Jterm course takes students on a fascinating journey through the visual language of faith, exploring how different religions have used art to express the divine, tell sacred stories, and create spaces for worship and reflection.

Students will examine sacred imagery across multiple religious traditions before diving deeper into Christian artistic traditions.

The course features an exciting field trip to St. Theodosius Cathedral, where students will experience breathtaking sacred art firsthand and learn from experts about the symbolism and craftsmanship behind religious masterpieces.

Through creative art projects, thoughtful discussions, and collaborative presentations, students will grapple with compelling questions: How do artists represent the sacred? What controversies surround religious imagery? How has the depiction of religious figures evolved across cultures and centuries? The course culminates with student presentations showcasing their own creative interpretations of sacred themes.

Songwriting & Studio Recording –PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

Got something to say? Say it in a song! In this hands-on, collaborative course, we'll dive into the world of songwriting.

We'll listen to and explore a mix of musical genres for inspiration (Pop, Indie, R&B, Rock, Country, and more), break down how great songs are built, and then you'll create your own original song that reflects your voice and style.

Once your song is ready, we're heading to a professional recording studio in Kent, OH, where you'll record your masterpiece and leave with a high-quality version of your very own song to show your friends and family.

No musical talent needed—just a love for music and a story to tell. Join with some friends or as a solo act!

The Business of Food – PM

Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12

This 5-day course takes students beyond the dining room and into the heart of the local food industry. Through daily visits from a variety of restaurants—from small family-owned establishments to trendy caterers and high-volume kitchens—students will explore the full spectrum of what it takes to run a successful food business.

Each day explores different aspects of restaurant operations, allowing students to engage with chefs, managers, and owners to learn about the strategic, creative, and logistical decisions behind every dish that ends up on a plate. From sourcing ingredients and managing inventory to menu development, pricing strategy, labor costs, and customer service, students will gain a practical understanding of how passion and business intersect in the culinary world.
