Middle School Jterm Overview

Registration for Middle School Jterm begins on Sunday, October 5, 2025.

Participation in Jterm 2026 (January 6, 7, 8) is an academic expectation for all middle school students. Students who are not registered for Jterm should not report to school and will receive unexcused absences for the week.

Grade 6 students must enroll for their grade-specific Jterm. Sixth graders will participate in three excursion days of enrichment activities, hands-on experiences, and meaningful service opportunities as a class.

Grade 7 and Grade 8

Students may choose from the following options:

- All-day class
- Morning (AM) **and** afternoon (PM) class session - creating a full day experience
- Trip
- Student Independent Study (parent proposal required)

Camp Restore Missions Trip; with Historical Flair - TRIP

On this trip, students will get to serve the people of Detroit through the non-profit organization, Camp Restore. We will be helping to complete a variety of service projects that are needed in the community. We will also get the opportunity to experience some historical aspects of Detroit, visiting the African American History Museum, the Henry Ford Museum, and experience how Fords are built. We will begin in our own backyard in Hudson, learning how the city played an important role in the Underground Railroad.

Know, Grow, Go! (8th Grade Girls Retreat) - TRIP

Know, Grow, Go! Learn about faithful women of the past, grow in who you are now, and practice changing the future in the 3.5-day adventure! You will enjoy times of fellowship, fun, Bible study, worship, cooking, and local service projects at women's ministries while staying overnight at a beautiful lodge in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. CVCA Alumni and staff will join us to encourage students in their faith and womanhood. Plus, we'll visit a local coffee shop, Kalahari, and much more!

Prepare to Believe - TRIP

Grades: 8 only

Trip dates: January 6-8

Eighth graders will be taken on a trip of a lifetime where they will walk through history as described by God in the Bible and have a blast exploring science and creation together.

On Day 1, we will stop in Dayton, OH, on our way down to Kentucky for a jaw-dropping experience as our students see the science that God created played out in both air and space at the National Air Force Museum. Then, after some evening bowling and a Chipotle dinner on day 1, we will be hitting the hotels and enjoying some fellowship together and a good night's rest.

Day 2 will land us aboard a life-sized replica of Noah's Ark as described in Genesis, over one and a half football fields in length! Inside the ark they will visit exhibits showing artists renderings of what animals may have looked like back then and how they could have all fit easily inside the ark. Challenges of food, water, waste, and survival will all be embraced and explored, all from a biblical perspective. One of the best parts of this day is our 1-hour Q and A session with creation science expert Brian Osborne, where we get to ask him questions, big or small, and he points us to the scriptures and creation around us for answers. Then, after some Go Kart and Laser Tag fun, we head back to our hotels for the night.

Day 3 will take us to the Creation Museum, where there are over 140 state-of-the-art exhibits portraying the 7 C's of history from a biblical worldview perspective: Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross, and Consummation. Students are brought up close for an insider's view of the creation of the universe! This is one of my favorite places on the planet as it answers so many big questions about our world, the bible, and how it all fits together. We will be challenged to stand on the authority of the Word of God as we navigate life and the questions we encounter along the way.

This Jterm trip will be a fun and memorable experience for eighth graders as the pages of scripture are brought to life, showing overwhelming evidence that supports the biblical account of history.

In this course, we will journey through Tolkien's epic to uncover how faith, hope, sacrifice, providence, and redemption shape the story. Together, we will explore questions like: How does Frodo's burden mirror the Christian understanding of sin? What do Aragorn, Gandalf, and Sam teach us about servant leadership and Christlike love? Where does Tolkien's Faith worldview subtly guide the tale of Middle-earth?

Colors of the Creator - PM

This Jterm course will be a creative space for students to produce meaningful artwork while exploring the rich diversity of the Church, both locally and globally. Students will study various communities in Northeast Ohio and learn about Urban Vision, a nonprofit organization that serves the refugee and international population in Akron. The primary goal of the course is to create portraits of current and former students involved with Urban Vision while also celebrating the

beauty of diversity within the body of Christ. As part of the experience, students will visit the Cleveland Museum of Art to gain inspiration from professional artists, which they will incorporate into their own work. The completed portraits will be displayed at both Urban Vision and CVCA.

Creative Writing Workshop - PM
