Founded in 1968, Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy is a private, college-preparatory, non-denominational, Christian school serving grades 6-12. Our mission statement is lived out in our faculty and staff who serve 1,230 students daily by walking shoulder to shoulder, loving, caring, and pointing students to Christ. *Educating and Cultivating Servants for Christ* are not just words, but something CVCA strives for daily with our students.

Excellence is a part of CVCA both academically and spiritually and permeates our athletics and fine arts programs. Students meet rigorous admissions standards and come from diverse backgrounds spread over 9 counties, 22 school districts, and more than 200 area churches.

Our facilities include a 188,000 square-foot building with state-of-the-art technology, 7 science labs, 31,000 square-foot fieldhouse, competition gymnasium, 700-seat chapel/auditorium, 6 fine arts classrooms, and 70 acres of sports facilities, including a turf stadium and all-weather track.

A Great Start to Middle School

At the start of each school year, CVCA middle school students participate in grade-level-specific retreats with their classmates. Each retreat provides opportunities to meet new friends and teachers while engaging in action-packed activities. Programming varies by grade level, but each retreat includes team-building activities designed to bond their class. Students may participate in games, ropes courses, kayaking, rock climbing, zip lines, swimming, crafting, and other adventures.

With scripture as the foundation, students are challenged to grow closer to the Lord and one another during times of spiritual enrichment that include great music and messages.



Middle School Curriculum

Our middle school programming is designed to encourage academic, spiritual, social, and physical growth during these critical years of development and transition. Dedicated middle school educators teach the core subjects of Bible, English, Math, Science, and Social Studies while preparing students for the demands of the college-prep program they will encounter in high school. Students also have the opportunity to grow in the areas of World Language, Physical Education, Fine Arts, and Technology.

With eight academic periods in the school schedule, middle school students must enroll in at least seven classes each semester. One study hall should complete the schedule.



Middle School Jterm

The grade-specific middle school Jterm program is designed to cultivate spiritual, educational, and personal growth in each student.

Sixth grade students participate in a unified experience allowing our youngest students to have a unique and developmentally appropriate time of experiential learning and class bonding.

Seventh and eighth-graders select from regional trip opportunities as well a menu of experiential alternative educational experiences that are equal parts fun and educational.

As a college-prep institution, we take very seriously the goal of preparing students for higher education.

Mentorships, Internships, and Educational Experiences

Our Schools of Distinction program provides two-year specialty tracks for juniors and seniors wanting to explore and prepare for careers in the Arts and Humanities, Business, Computer Science, Engineering, Medicine, or Ministry. Each school provides students with experiential learning within their professional fields through advanced electives, mentoring, internships, and more, thus providing insight into God's calling for their lives. Some of the Schools of Distinction courses offer college credit options.

School of Arts and Humanities

SOAH offers a platform for students to explore how their God-given creative talents can be used to tackle real-world problems and address important questions. Students can choose one of four concentrations: communication arts, visual arts, social sciences, or music. They can develop their skills through elective courses, an individual capstone project, and hands-on career exploration opportunities.

School of Business and Entrepreneurship

SOBE prepares high school students for success in undergraduate business programs and in the marketplace. Students study all major business disciplines through a biblical worldview and collaboratively operate incorporated businesses. Courses include Accounting, Marketing, Entrepreneurship, and Business Management.

School of Computer Science

SOCS provides a robust curriculum designed to help high school students grow into successful, impactful Christians within an undergraduate computer science program. This program touches on several major computer science disciplines, including game design, programming, IT, cybersecurity, and app development. Students delve deeper into areas of interest through individualized projects, guest lectures, Jterm opportunities, and connections with local universities and companies.

School of Engineering

SOE aims to prepare high school students to become successful and impactful Christians in an undergraduate engineering program. The curriculum touches on all major engineering disciplines, including Engineering Methods, Mechanical, Civil, Electrical, Computer, and Aeronautical. The program concludes with a Senior Capstone project.

School of Classics

CVCA's School of Classics is a series of high school elective courses exploring ideas from the great books that shaped western civilization as part of the Omnibus curriculum. The courses combine the study of history, literature, and theology, but also allow students to participate in the full breadth of the CVCA curriculum. Students complete a multi-year sequence at the 9th and 10th-grade levels. Students in the School of Classics are encouraged to take at least three credits in classical languages (Latin and/or Biblical Greek) as well as AP Seminar and AP Research as a capstone program.

Pursuing Victory Beyond Competition

CVCA offers a broad range of high school and middle school athletic opportunities for all students. Our offerings include 26 varsity programs, 16 high school sports, 11 middle school sports, and over 60 total teams. The Royals program is comprised of dedicated Christian coaches and excellent facilities. The school is a member of the North Coast Conference (NCC) at the high school level and competes independently at the middle school level.

The competitiveness of our CVCA athletes and teams has repeatedly advanced the Royals to the state level and has produced many state champions. Many athletes go on to receive college scholarships and continue to compete in the NCAA and NAIA. Our ultimate goal, however, is that the world will see Christ in us as we compete and that we would know victory beyond competition.

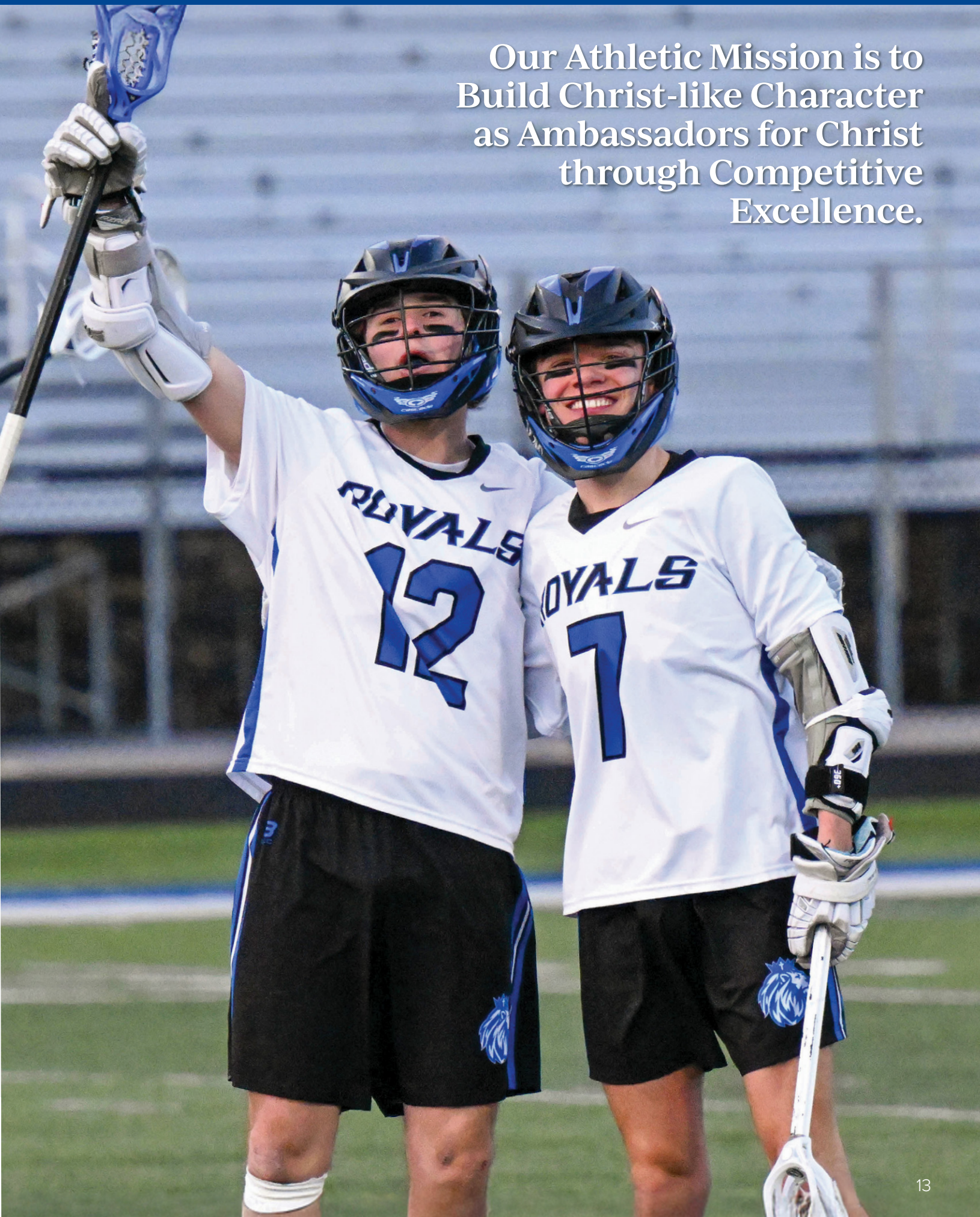

Led by a team of talented and specialized instructors, our Fine Arts Program has grown to meet the increasing interest in the arts. Students have a wide variety of opportunities in vocal and instrumental music, theater, and the visual arts.

Performing Arts

Our 11 music performing arts groups include six choirs, two bands, two handbell choirs, a string orchestra, and an extra-curricular jazz band.

The Royal Theatre

Each year, CVCA's Royal Theatre produces one major play and one major musical involving both middle and high school thespians. We also host a popular summer theater camp for younger students.

Classroom Arts Instruction

We offer classroom instruction for both beginner and advanced students, including AP Music Theory, AP Drawing, AP 2D Art & Design, and AP 3D Art & Design.

Visual Arts

In Visual Arts, we offer 13 classes for students interested in 2D and 3D mediums, graphic design, video media, advanced multi-media, photography, and Yearbook.

Equipping Students to Impact the World

Daily Bible classes, weekly Chapel services, annual mission trips, continual service opportunities, and Christian clubs help our faculty and staff connect with students and equip them to impact others for the Kingdom of God. Connections Groups:

The goal of *Connections* is to give middle school students a chance to deal with life issues by sharing and listening in a community environment. Each group is gender specific, includes 10 to 15 students, and meets weekly with a caring faculty/staff mentor.



THRIVE:

THRIVE days are monthly breaks from the regular academic curriculum for students and faculty to connect over particular shared interests. This program provides a pause from the rigor of the school day and allows students to relax while enjoying an activity they choose in a non-teaching environment. Faculty and staff members offer an activity/topic they enjoy, and students choose from the options. Because individuals find relaxation and refreshment in different ways, THRIVE options include a range of activity levels – some quiet and calming and others more energetic and physical.

Service Opportunities:

Each semester, all students (grades 6-12) are required to participate in service to the community. Our students

volunteer with local churches, para-church ministries, and mission organizations. This service component is just one way we attempt to help cultivate servants for Christ.

Fostering Community, Opportunity, and School Spirit

Making International Friendships

Students from Around the World

CVCA has been hosting international students for the past 30 years from Norway, Brazil, Dominican Republic, Cambodia, South Korea, China, Chile, Germany, and Russia. While at CVCA, these students attend classes and school activities and visit local attractions such as Cedar Point, Lake Erie, and the Cuyahoga Valley National Park.

In most cases, our international students are juniors who come to CVCA for one year of study. We have also had international students attend CVCA during tenth grade and stay through graduation. Many matriculate to American colleges and universities.

Short Term Exchange Program

In addition to our long-term International Student Program, CVCA offers *STEP: Short Term Exchange Program*. Through STEP, students from our sister schools in Norway and Brazil come to CVCA for a ten-day cultural visit in the fall.

During their visit, our international guests stay with CVCA families to fully experience CVCA life and American culture. They attend classes and join in school activities. CVCA honors STEP students with a special farewell celebration.

At each grade level, students require guidance tailored to their unique journey. Our Office of School and College Counseling works collaboratively with students and their families to enhance their high school experience and help them achieve their educational goals. Our academic counselors are knowledgeable about the rigor and expectations of our curriculum, Ohio's graduation requirements, and the college preparation process. As students move through their middle and high school years, they receive coaching and support to help them make the best choices for their next steps – whether that involves enrolling in an advanced course, applying to a School of Distinction, or finding the right college fit.

Your Partner in the College Search

What do colleges and universities look for when reviewing your application? How can you find a college that meets your needs? What is the process for applying for scholarships and financial aid? These are just a few of the questions families encounter as students progress through high school. At CVCA, our College Counselors are here to assist families through the often complicated college application and decision-making process. By utilizing tools such as Naviance and YouScience, our counselors help students explore and prepare for their post-high school goals.

Academic Success and Support

The Office of Academic Success and Instructional Services (OASIS) helps students develop the skills and confidence necessary to achieve at CVCA, in college, and beyond. Our mission is to help Educate and Cultivate students to understand who God created them to be and develop an understanding of their academic strengths and weaknesses so they can learn when and how to ask for help during their time at CVCA.

OASIS provides a variety of resources for middle and high school students based on their unique educational profiles, ranging from daily support as needed to weekly check-ins with an Academic Success Instructor.

CVCA uses a staggered timeline for 7th to 12th-grade admissions applications. Please keep these dates and schedule in mind when applying for enrollment for the 2026-2027 school year. Sixth grade applications are accepted and reviewed continuously.

 - A **complete** application, including interview, must be completed by the deadline to be considered in that round.
 - Students have two weeks to enroll once notified of acceptance.
- Each CVCA application includes a non-refundable \$100 Admissions Application Fee.
 - An entrance exam is part of the application process. Exams are scheduled at cvcaroyals.org/apply.
 - Admissions announcements will be delivered via email.

Ohio EdChoice Scholarships

Every Ohio K-12 student is eligible for an OEC Scholarship, a state-funded school choice option that assists families with the cost of private education. OEC Scholarship amounts vary based on a family’s income and household size. **Once enrolled** at CVCA, families may apply for an OEC Scholarship.

Scholarships

- 35 Presidential Scholarships are awarded to our highest scoring applicants who test and apply before the scholarship deadline. Final decisions are based on strength of application.
- Students who meet our admission standards and have an IEP may be eligible for a Jon Peterson Scholarship.

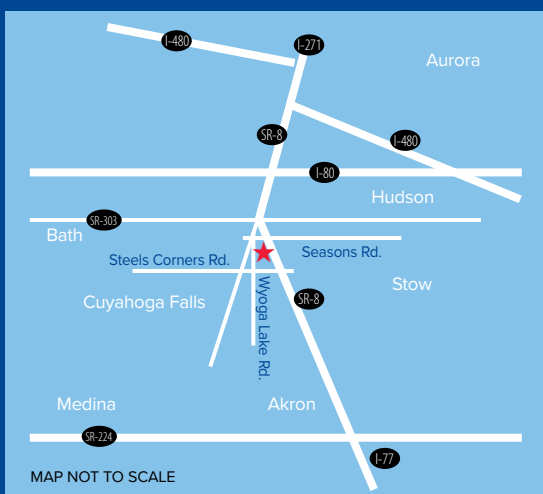
